OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS AND CERTIFICATES ATTESTATION

Attestation is a procedure to confirm validity of the seal and signature on documents issued in Fiji or abroad.

Attestation services, provided by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Fiji and Fijian Diplomatic Missions abroad.

INDIVIDUAL DOCUMENTS

Includes but not limited to: educational documents (certificate & transcripts are treated as two different documents):

Birth certificates
Death certificate
Certificate of Marriage
Power of Attorney
To Whom It May Concern letters

COMMERCIAL DOCUMENTS

Includes but not limited to:

Registrations of Fijian Companies Company Trade Licenses Partnership or Shareholder Certificates Corporate Tax Certificate Power of Attorney of Commercial Nature

INSTRUCTION TO BE CONSIDERED:

For documents issued in Fiji:

- 1. Original document must be certificated by a Justic of Peace, Attorney (Barrister/Solicitor) Commissioner of Oaths in Fiji or bear Apostille stamp by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Government of the Republic of Fiji.
- 2. Apply for attestation in the UAE through the Fiji Embassy in Abu Dhabi at: aco@fijiemb.ae or secondsecretary@fijiemb.ae.
- 3. Include the original document. If the document is copy in form of digital copy (scan or photocopies) than it must be certified by a Notary Public or Barrister/Solicitor, Commissioner of Oaths or Justice of Peace.
- 4. Original documents / certified copies of the documents for attestation can be either brought in person or courier to the Embassy.
- 5. The attestation charge for a single document / page is **AED150.00** which can be paid via bank transfer to the Embassy's account.

For documents issued outside Fiji:

- 1. Original document must be attested or Apostilled Stamped by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of issuing country.
- 2. Document can then be attested by one of the Fiji Embassy or Consulate in issuing country.
- 3. Documents must include the original attested stamp and seal.
